1. Concert on Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> November at 8 pm: The Max Planck Society and the State Opera of Bavaria organized an excellent event entitled "Sphärenmusik – Harmonie des Himmels" (in German) where the Leibniz laureate Prof. Hasinger (Director of the MPI for Plasma Physics and formerly Director from the MPI of Extraterrestrial Physics) will present the mysteries of the universe. This talk will be followed by the musical works of Pierrot Lunaire op. 12 from Arnold Schönberg and Symphonie Nr. 41 C-Dur KV 551 "Jupiter" from Mozart under the direction of Kent Nagano, the music director of the Bavarian State Opera, in the Cuvilliés-Theater (close to Odeonsplatz).
